Mitch Gawthorn, an Operations Manager at a Kakadu hotel, is grateful every day for his CareFlight trauma training. In fact, shortly after he completed the course, his new skills were put into action, when a call came in about a bad car accident an hour away.

At the scene, Mitch quickly assessed his patients, focusing particularly on a woman trapped inside her car. He examined her for major injuries, and then helped the fire brigade get her out. Mitch's quick thinking and confidence undoubtedly helped save lives that day. Mitch said if it wasn't for his CareFlight emergency trauma training, he'd have been a lot less confident as a first responder that day.


You're there when life hangs in the balance

Steve McDonald knows that if it wasn't for CareFlight, he wouldn't be here. When his motorcycle was hit by a caravan that swerved into his lane, Steve was thrown into the air, skidding 90 metres along the road.

When our crew reached Steve, they could see his foot was partially torn off and his leg bone was protruding through his pants. On the flight to hospital they had to pump all the blood they had into him to keep him alive. Steve lost his leg, but he has a new prosthetic leg and a profound gratitude for the crew who saved him – and people like you.

Help comes fast, thanks to you

A sudden accident took Melanie Corbett from riding a horse to an urgent flight with CareFlight for emergency treatment. 21-year-old Melanie, a professional track rider, was working a horse at the track when the horse took fright, shot through a fence and fell, landing on top of Melanie.

Melanie had a spinal injury which needed specialist treatment in Newcastle, around four to five hours by road. CareFlight swung into action, safely flying Melanie and her mum in less than an hour. Timely transport has helped her recover, faster – she's not quite ready to get back on the horse yet, but because of your support, she's on her way.

In 2017, Riley Hilditch was swimming with his friends on the Central Coast when the unthinkable happened: he hit his head and was gravely injured. If it wasn't for the lifesaving efforts of CareFlight's rapid response helicopter crew, Riley would never have made it home alive. The accident broke his neck, and Riley spent over 40 weeks in hospital.

But four years later, Riley with his mum Suzanne, and sister Taylah, got the chance to visit the CareFlight base and meet with the crew that saved Riley's life. It was an emotional moment for everyone, Riley especially. He's so grateful for the help he received, when he truly needed it most.

It takes a range of specialised aircraft, road vehicles, equipment, and crew members to save Australians lives most in need. Last year, we chalked up 10,900+ total flight hours and cared for more than 9,000 patients – and it was all possible because of you.

It's a long way from where we started, 35 years ago, as a single helicopter, daylight-only operation. Back then, we flew just four missions a month. Today, our doctors, paramedics and nurses fly from 12 airports or bases, on helicopters, turbo-prop air ambulances and specially designed medijets to save lives around Australia and internationally.

Our unrivalled service depends on you

Our specialist aeromedical crew rely on state-of-the-art equipment to provide the best medical care; from portable ultrasounds and heart defibrillators, to night vision goggles which play a critical role on search and rescue missions after dark.

Our fleet has expanded and advanced in response to technological breakthroughs. Today, our Gulfstream G150 aeromedical jet is the first of its kind in Australia – with a flight speed of more than 1,000 km p/h and a range of over 5,300 km, it can handle some of the longest medical retrieval routes in the world. While the Airbus H145 rapid response helicopter is also unique in Australia, built to the most advanced design for saving lives.
